



The MacKaye Shelter

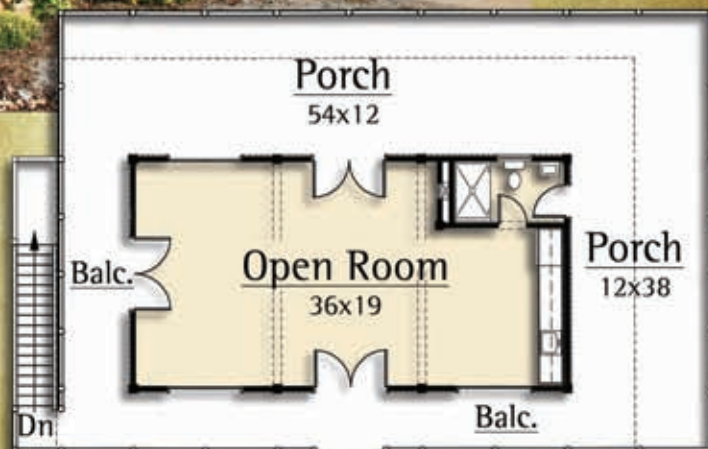
